3. CHAIR

4. TITLE

5. TERMS OF REFERENCE

6. BUDGET PROPOSALS 2023-24

The Committee **RESOLVED** that Option 2 of the alternatives submitted by the Youth Engagement Working Group to the Finance and Grants Committee on 27 October 2022 be included in the Council's proposed budget for 2023-24.

The Committee agreed that there is no accepted financial measure of the current and long-term benefits of Council-funded youth work. Ben Owen-Jones suggested that the Clerk should approach the office of the Gwent Police and Crime Commissioner to enquire as to the degree to which they valued initiatives such as the Council-funded youth work.
