25. Off The Streets

Alana Insley, project manager of Off The Streets, discussed her recent progress report as presented to Councillors. Councillors asked the following questions: -

Cllr. Dyson – Why is there is a reduction in the number of girls attending?

A number of older girls are choosing to spend time with their friendship groups outside of Off The Streets. In addition, Aneurin Bevan have lost staff who were specifically trained to work with girls and this has had an impact on the sessions and support they offer to Off The Streets. Off The Streets are encouraging girls to bring friends to their sessions in the hope of increasing numbers again.

Do you get feedback from the parents about the young person's behaviour at home?

Yes. The feedback from parents tends to be positive and they believe Off The Street sessions that their child is attending is making a difference to their behaviour.

Cllr. Dyson offered support in the way of providing a drug and alcohol talk to the young people at Off The Streets through her work.

Cllr. Adamson - How many staff are employed?

There are 4 people employed by Off The Streets, including Alana, and they are each contracted/paid 12 hours per week.

Cllr. Owen-Jones asked if the names of the young persons contained in the report could be removed and/or changed in future reports. Alana agreed to do this.

The Committee will wait until the next meeting to decide the budget line for Off The Streets.

There is the possibility of adding a new budget line for school extra-curricular activities, such as providing transport, as suggested by Cllr. Rawcliffe. Cllr. Rawcliffe will investigate costs for this and report back at the next meeting.

The final budget for this committee will be agreed at the next meeting.
